The Friends of the Angel would like to invite you to help us by volunteering at the eighth Annual Walk to Remember on Saturday, May 5, 2018. Below is a list of volunteer jobs and the times which are needed for that day.

Set-Up Help: 8:00 – 10:00 a.m.

10 volunteers to help set up tents, tables, chairs, signs, garbage cans, etc.

Sign Placements: 8:00 – 10:00 a.m.

4-6 volunteers to help set up signs around the arboretum grounds to designate where things are.

Parking Lot Attendants: 8:00-10:00 a.m.

6-9 volunteers to help direct cars into open parking spots and close the lots when full.

Greeters: 9:15-10:00 a.m.—

4 volunteers to greet participants as they arrive and direct them to the registration table. Two greeters at each entrance of the arboretum.

Path Directional Attendants: 10:00-11:30 a.m.

6 volunteers (three pairs) to be situated around Rice Lake (we will direct you) to steer people in the right direction around the lake. It would be helpful if you are familiar with the path around Rice Lake.

Clean-up Help: 12:00-12:30 p.m.

10 volunteers to help take down tables, signs, pop up tents, collect and box the information items, put away the craft table items, etc.

Lunch Tent: 11:00-12:30 p.m.

6 volunteers to help distribute lunches and direct people in line.

Craft Table: 9:00-10:00 a.m. or 11:00-12:00 p.m.

4 volunteers to assist families with decorating and assembling various angel crafts. Materials will be provided.

Face Painter Assistant: 9:00-10:30 or 10:30-12:00 p.m.

2 volunteers —one for each shift to help direct the line as people are waiting.

Manning a Water Station: 10:30-11:30 a.m.

Two water stations will be set up— (1) Start of the walk; (2) Freedom Field off of Rice Lake Pkwy
Two to three volunteers at each station are needed to distribute water bottles and collect empty water bottles to recycle.
